Dear parents,

How can a poor man leave his children a rich inheritance? It seems paradoxical, but it is true, at least from my own experiences, as inheritance is definitely more than money and other assets.

A good friend of mine is one of the few loving fathers I have come to know. He stayed up to feed his newborns in the middle of the night, and when taking his young family to long trips in Europe and America, he would carry one baby on his back while pushing the stroller holding his older child, making life as a homemaker relatively easy for his young bride. Running a successful business in his prime more than twenty-five years ago, he would send his kids to school in his Porsche every morning and take them to sports and music lessons on weekends. Who wouldn't want a dad like him? This loving father, however, is a man of very few words, and his kids have learnt to communicate with him via their mother.

Twenty-five years on, two of his kids have been married with children, and his son's family continues to live with them in their 6000-square-foot mansion. This proud grandfather 'fights' with his daughter-in-law for holding and feeding his baby grandson, and has vowed in front of all family members that he would take care of his grandson's education expenses in the future.

Such unsolicited undertaking may be necessary as none of his kids seem to have picked up his shrewd investment and financial management skills. He gave each of his kids a million dollars upon their graduation, but instead of saving or investing the money, they squandered it all on luxuries and travels. His son stayed home for a year upon graduation as he couldn't find a satisfactory job, worked a couple of years then quit as he disliked the politics in the office, and has just been back in the job market for a few months after resting at home for almost two years. His other unmarried daughter has difficulty keeping up with her credit card payments, and he has had to bail her out more than once.

Interestingly, my friend's experience isn't uncommon among my generation of baby boomers who were generally poor in their childhood and teenage years, but landed a decent career or made a fortune without any help from their parents. Many of their children, however, have not been able to repeat their success

stories but choose to rely on their provisions. Some of my less wealthy friends have remortgaged their homes so that they can help their kids. I respect their decision but do feel worried about their financial situation after their retirement as well as the life of their children and grandchildren in the years to come.

A smothering father may choose to provide for his kids till his final breath; a truly loving and wise father, however, helps his grown-up children to spread their wings and provide for themselves.

I am confident that you would rather be wise than indulgent by leaving your children a lasting inheritance. If so, teach and nurture essential life skills in your kids while they are still young. Happy Father's Day!
